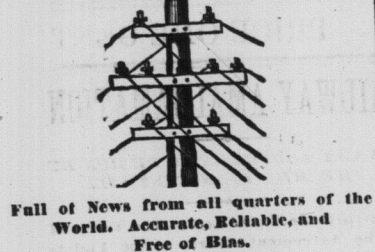

A circular has been issued from the Ontario Bureau of Industries by Mr. Blane, inviting manufacturers of the kinds in industry carried on, name of place and firm or company, capital invested, number of persons employed, total amount of wages per annum, total value of raw material used, and value of annual product.

which might be voted to begin with. The advice of the association has been asked in the matter, but that body has not yet taken the responsibility of officially making any specific recommendation.

No far there are two distinct plans before the government and the association. One is that of establishing three model creameries in the east, centre, and west of the province respectively, the cost of which is estimated to be covered by \$10,000.

The plan advocated by Mr. Lynch is different. He proposes to form a company for the purpose of supplying the latest and most improved machinery and other apparatus for use in private dairies all over the country, with government assistance in some form to help the enterprise along.

The question then is really between two plans—that of large creameries and that of private dairies. Mr. Lynch contends, and we think with much force, that while people attending the creamery schools, as we may call them, might, on their leaving, be fully qualified to manage the making of good butter, in a creamery, the knowledge thus acquired would scarcely help them a cent's worth towards making good butter at home, or in any farmer's private dairy.

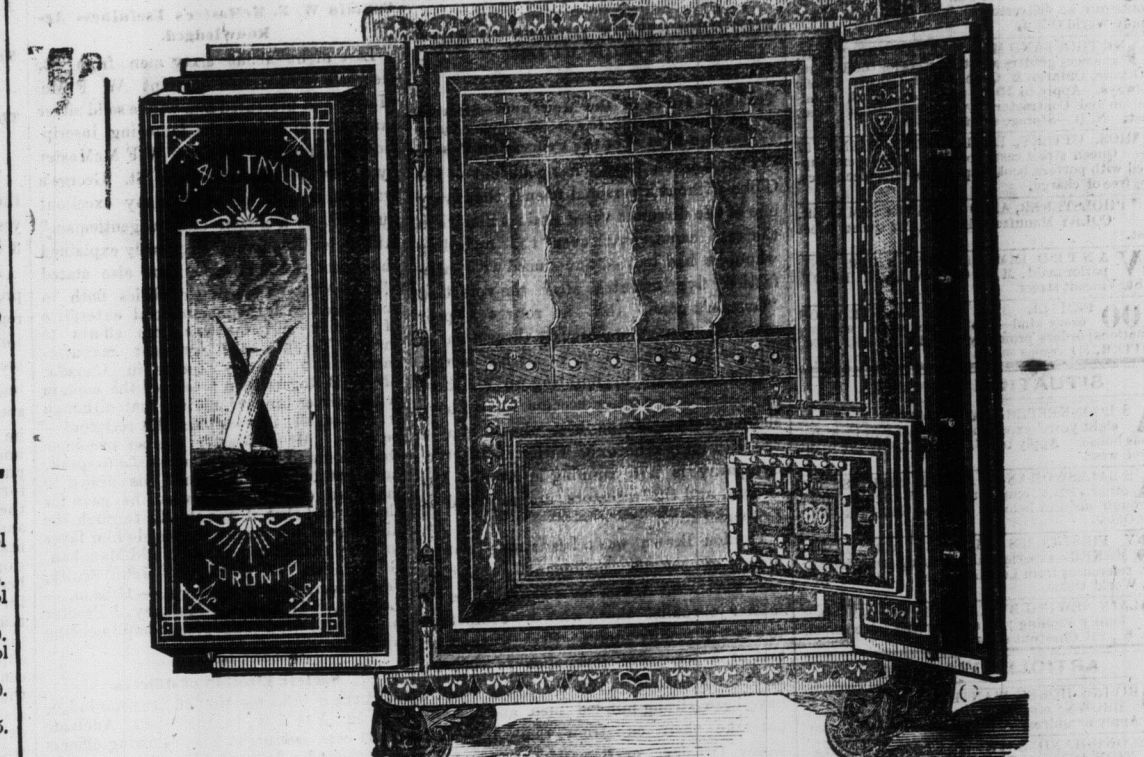
