AT THE PRESBYTERY.

Congregations United Knax Church to Be Mortgaged for \$10,000—The Chester Trouble-Resolution of Sympathy.

The Toronto Presbytery assembled in the lecture room of New St. Andrew's Church with an attendance of over 50. The Rev. G. M. Milligan, as moderator, was in the chair, and the Rev. Dr. Gregg, acting clerk, officiated. Not a great deal of business was transacted, but there was much discussion over what was done. The three congregations of Dixie, Waldon and Port Credit sent in a request to be united, and to get a grant of \$100 from the Augmenlation Committee. For some time the presbytery was plunged into uncertainty as to what the congregations needed, but finally the matter was cleared up, and the request was granted.

The trensurer made no report, as a number of congregations had not sent in their statements, but amnounced that there were funds sufficient to allow the usual bonus of \$50 to the clerk, Rev. R. Monteith, and accordingly moved that the bonus be given. The motion was seconded by Dr. Parsons and passed.




