### AMERICAN WOMEN TO HONOR LADY ABERDEEN

HAMILTON, April 30.—The Marchioness of Aberdeen, wife of the for-

mer Governor-General of Canada and founder of the National Council of Women, is to be signally honored by the women of America, who will, upon arrival at the boundary line on the international bridge, Niagara Falls, of the special C. P. R. train bearing European delegates to the International Council

of Women at Washington, present her ladyship with a golden key, symbolic of free entry into the United States. About 160 women, representing 31 European countries and every branch of women's work, were aboard the train which arrived here to-day from Toronto.

Leaving for Niagara Falls on their special train to-morrow morning, the delegates, including some from Quebec, Montreal, Toronto and Western cities, who are joining the others here, will be met on arrival by the Queen Victoria Park commission and shown the various places of special interest. The

Canadian visit will end with the little ceremony on the international bridge at 3 o'clock in the afternoon.

## NAME ONTARIO GUIDE TRAINER

Provincial Council To Appoint  
New Officer

HEADQUARTERS HERE

Companies In Province Increase  
By 91 In Year

A fully qualified Girl Guide trainer is to be appointed for the Province of Ontario, with headquarters in London, to carry forward organization and to give expert training to Guides and Guiders. The decision to make such an appointment was reached at this week's meeting of the executive of the Ontario Provincial Girl Guide Council, over which Mrs. E. B. Smith, of this city, provincial commissioner, presided. This was the first meeting of the executive since the annual.

So rapid and so gratifying is the advance of the Guide movement that further staff was deemed necessary. In the past 12 months 91 new companies have been formed in Ontario. Many more companies would be available for organization, it was stated, if training could be secured for officers and guiders and the new company launched on its way with at least a moderate background of experience.

The new officers will be appointed by the council in September and will make her headquarters here.

Arrangements were made to hold the next annual meeting in March, 1926, in this city, and to make this a two-day session.
