Regular meeting of Council: present—Reeve, Johnston, Saunders, Doan and Hawn.

Minutes of former meeting read and adopted.

Johnston—Saunders, that Mr. Kenward, Chairman Hydro Commission Electric Power of Watford, sign agreement with Grand Trunk Railway to cross their track.—Carried.

Hawn—Doan, that Bylaw No. 3, appointing village constable, sanitary and nuisance inspector and truant officer, be read first time.—Carried.

Johnston—Saunders, that Bylaw No. 3, be read second time, filling in name of J. F. Elliot at \$15.00 per month, from 10th March last.—Carried.

Doan—Hawn, that Bylaw No. 3 be read third time and passed.—Carried.

Johnston—Doan, that Bylaw No. 4, to provide for trimming of trees on streets be read first time.—Carried.

Doan—Johnston, that Bylaw No. 4, be read second time and filled in with committee's names—J. F. Elliot, F. Kenward, and Joshua Saunders.—Carried.

Hawn—Kenward, that Bylaw No. 4 be read third time and passed.—Carried.

Saunders—Johnston, that A. Brown, J. W. McLaren and John McKecher be appointed a committee to visit the cemetery and report to the Council the best means of improving and beautifying the same.—Motion lost.

Hawn—Doan, that we hold Court of Revision on assessment roll on Tuesday, May 29th, at 10 o'clock, a.m.—Carried.

Doan—Johnston, that we authorize our constable to collect all unpaid license fees.—Carried.

Johnston—Saunders, that Reeve and Clerk notify Grand Trunk Railway to complete the work approaching the bridge so that the Corporation can construct their portion of sidewalks.—Carried.

BROOKE COUNCIL.

Alvinston, May 5th, 1917.

Council met pursuant to adjournment. Members all present. Minutes of former meeting read and adopted.

Engineer's report on the Cameron drain opposite lot 1, 2, 3, con. 2, 3, served by the Township of Enniskillen read, estimated cost \$210.

Johnston—Sutton, that report be adopted and by-law be prepared authorizing work and loan.—Carried.

Mr. Lance Corrine asked that he be allowed to perform all his statue labor on the 12-13, con. road in order to fill some holes in road caused by the water crossing.

Sutton—Gilliland, that statue labor on w pt. 4, con. 12, remain the same as in the past and repairing the 12, 13, con. road opposite lot 4, be referred to commissioner.—Carried.

Mr. Angus Stewart, contractor on Dolbear—Gray drain, owing to illness, tendered his resignation.

Johnston—Kennedy, that accepting the resignation of contractor on Dolbear—Gray drain be left with the commissioner.—Carried.

Gilliland—Kennedy, that N. A. McLeay be paid \$15.00 for one sheep killed by dogs and Duncan Campbell \$30.00 for sheep worried by dogs.—Carried.

Kennedy—Johnston, that Court of Revision on Rilet drain by-law be reopened.—Carried.

Johnston—Kennedy, that assessment made by Engineer on Rilet drain be adopted without any change, and by-law be read a third time and finally passed, and court closed.—Carried.

By-law read and passed.

Sutton—Gilliland, that by-law be prepared authorizing the collection pro rata of \$90.00 overpaid from lots assessed in by-law No. 15 of 1913, for the repair to the Burford McVick drain, to be placed on 1917 collector's roll for collection and balance of overpayment to be charged to municipality.—Carried.

Communication:—from Sec. of Tipperary Red Society, with a report of the work being done and asking for a grant to aid Red Cross work.

Gilliland—Kennedy, that \$25.00 be granted to Tipperary Red Cross society.—Carried.

By-law submitted and read authorizing repairs to the 4-5 con. drain, opposite lots 7, 8, 9.

Sutton—Johnston, that by-law be provisionally adopted printed in pamphlet form and copy served on each party assessed, and a Court of Revision on same be held in Code's Hall, Alvinston, on Saturday the 2nd day of June 1917, at 3 o'clock, p. m. Hugh Kennedy to be commissioner and to serve by-laws.—Carried.

Mr. T. H. Myres asked for \$500 be advanced for telephone purposes.

Kennedy—Sutton, that \$500 be advanced the Advisory Board for telephone purposes.—Carried.

Gilliland—Kennedy, that Council do now adjourn to meet in Code's Hall, Alvinston, on the 2nd day of June 1917, and to open as a Court of Revision on the assessment roll at 2 p.m.—Carried.
