THE CANON ON CEMETERIES.

In response to Mr. Holmes' request, we here reprint the CANON ON THE MANAGEMENT OF CHURCH OF ENGLAND CEMETERIES IN THE DIOCESE OF BRITISH COLUMBIA.

I.

That The Incumbent and Churchwardens for the time being shall have the management and control of the Cemetery, subject to the general superintendence of the Archdeacon.

II.

That the said Incumbent and Churchwardens appoint a sexton, who may have sole charge of the grave-digging and keeping the ground in order.

III.

That every Cemetery shall be fenced and surveyed and mapped into burial spaces 5 feet by 10 feet.

IV.

That burial space of the above dimensions be disposed of in perpetuity, on the sum of five dollars \$5, which payment, together with others hereafter to be mentioned in the Schedule of Charges, to be devoted by the said Incumbent and Churchwardens to a fund, such a fund to be reserved for the sole purpose of payment of sexton, and clearing, inclosing and otherwise keeping the Cemetery in order. That persons on purchase of burial spaces shall receive the following document signed by the Incumbent, and one of the Churchwardens:

"Received from A. B. of the sum of for that piece of ground, part of the Church of England Cemetery at numbered on the map of the Cemetery, in the custody of the Incumbent and Churchwardens of the above piece of ground to be held by the said A. B. subject to the rules for the time being in force, for the management of the Cemetery.

V.

That no appropriated burial space be opened without the
