SHRDIAG RAILWAY.—We are happy to learn that the Railway between Shrdiac and the Bend is progressing more rapidly than was anticipated. Mr. Walker, of Quebec, the contractor of the Shediac end of the line, has 300 men at work, and adds to their number daily. He is pushing on most vigorous-ly. The other two contractors have each nearly the same number, and we o serve that Mr. Brookfield, the contractor near the Bensi, has advertised for 200 more

men in Prince Edwarf I-land.

The locamptive at Shaduc is being put in working order, and in another formight the scream of the steam-whistle will be heard along the railway for three miles along the Harbor of Shediac. It is anticipated that by the first of December next, the locomotive will be running 9 miles from Suedisc toward the Bend; and from the general progress of the work, there seems little doubt, that the whole line from Shediac to the Bend, will be traversed by railway cars early in April next.

While tan massive stone bridge across the Scadone river (near Shediae Harber,) is being finished, a temperary wooden bridge has been erected, and the ballasting of the line, by means of steam, will go on expeditiously.
