was introduced upon Resolution. See Canadian Commons Journals (1890), page 209.

I, therefore, decide that similar action should be taken with the Bill proposed by the Honourable Member.

Ordered, That Mr. Stevens have leave to bring in a Bill to amend the Criminal Code.

He accordingly presented the said Bill to the House, and the same was received and read the first time; and ordered to be read a second time at the next sitting of the House.

The House according to Order, resumed the adjourned Debate on the proposed motion of Mr. Bennett (Calgary) for an Address to His Royal Highness the Governor General, in answer to His Speech at the opening of the Session, and the proposed motion of Sir Wilfrid Laurier, in amendment thereto.

And the Debate continuing,—the said Debate was, on motion of Mr. Loggie, seconded by Mr. Gordon, adjourned.

And then The House, having continued to sit till twelve minutes before Twelve of the Clock, P.M., adjourned till To-morrow.
