CMHC—PERSONS UNDER CONTRACT

Ouestion No. 204-Mr. McKenzie:

- 1. What is the total number of persons under contract to the Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation and how many are retired public servants?
- 2. What was the total amount in (a) 1975 (b) 1976 paid to those under contract and how much of this was to retired public servants?

Hon. André Ouellet (Minister of State for Urban Affairs): I am advised as follows by Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation: 1. CMHC has 415 persons on a contract basis of employment. None of these are retired public servants.

2. Such contract employees were paid (a) \$1,852,890 in 1975, and (b) \$2,941,363 in 1976. None of these amounts were paid to retired public servants.

DREE GRANTS

In (a) 1975 (b) 1976 (c) 1977, were DREE grants allotted to the Constituency of Richmond and, if so (i) in what amount (ii) for what major economic sectors?

LIOUID MILK SUBSIDY

Ouestion No. 1.460-Mr. Lambert (Bellechasse):

In 1975, did the government subsidize liquid milk producers and industrial milk producers and, if so, what was the amount in each case?

Hon. E. F. Whelan (Minister of Agriculture): The Canadian dairy commission advises: yes. Subsidies paid to liquid milk producers for the dairy year 1975-76 totaled \$81,824,335. Subsidies paid to industrial milk producers for the dairy year 1975-76 totaled \$184,038,334.

COST OF EMR ADVERTISING

Ouestion No. 1,586-Mr. McKinnon:

- 1. What was the cost of the full page advertising campaign by the Department of Energy, Mines and Resources approximately March 31, 1978 which indicated the approximate mileage for several cars?
- 2. What was the cost of producing and distributing the 106 page book on information about buying a new or used car which was distributed by the Department of Energy, Mines and Resources on a request basis?

Hon. Alastair Gillespie (Minister of Energy, Mines and Resources): The Department of Energy, Mines and Resources reports as follows:

- 1. Approximately \$80,000.
- 2. Cost of producing and distributing (by mail) one car book—23.7 cents. As of April 20, 1978, 2.3 million copies have been printed and distributed.
