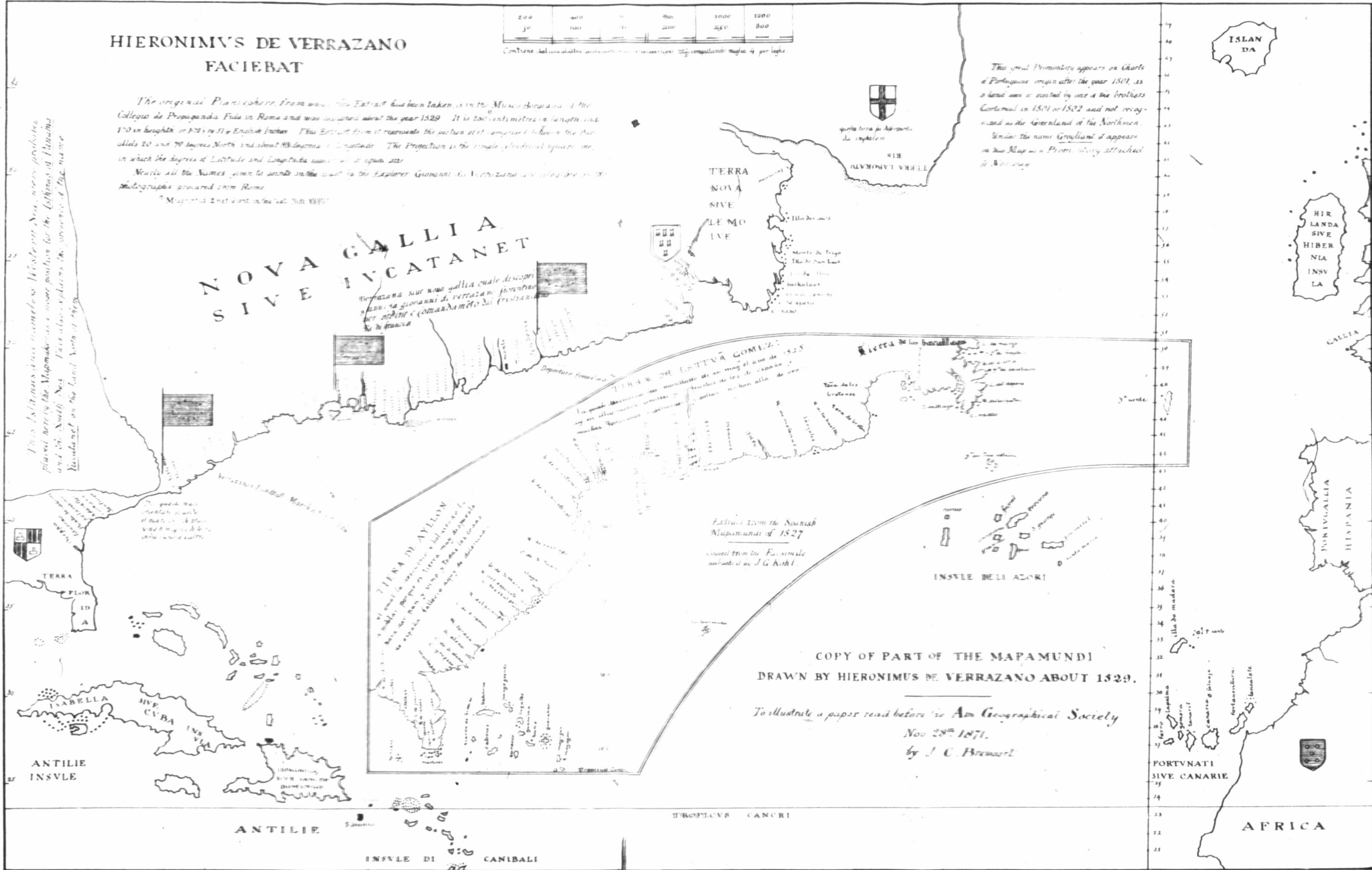

The original Planisphere, from which this Extract has been taken, is in the Museo Borghese of the Collegio de Propaganda Fide in Rome and was discovered about the year 1529. It is 200 centimetres in length and 170 in height, or 72 1/2 by 51 1/2 English inches. This Extract from it represents the portion of it comprised between the parallels 20 and 70 degrees North, and about 85 degrees of Longitude. The Projection is the simple cylindrical square one, in which the degrees of Latitude and Longitude appear as of equal size.

Nearly all the Names given to words in this map by the Explorer Giovanni de Verrazano are illegible in the photographs procured from Rome.

Scale: 1 cent = 1/2 mile

This Island is the same as the one placed here by the Mapmakers a more position for the Islands of Hispania and the North Sea. This also explains the presence of the name Hispania on the land west of here.
