SARATOGA, Aug. 27.—Gruber's bay
colt, Little Nephew, made another
good pot for his owner today by winning
the Adirondack Handicap for two-year-
olds, the big prize of the day, and one
of the best of the meet. The Gruber colt
was the favorite at even-money, and he
raced all the way with Mr. Snigs, but
tired rapidly toward the end, and just
lasted long enough to stall off Black-
broom, which came forward with a rush
in the last furlon. Spearhead, which
had been away back almost through the
entire race, also came ahead with a
rush towards the close, and got the show
money. There were many scratches
owing to the rain of the past night and
early morning, but those who figured
that it was a day for mudstake were dis-
appointed, as the mud was only on top,

FONT WINS HOTEL STAKE AT OTTAWA

Connaught Park Second Meet-
ing Opens Auspiciously—
Three Long Shots Land.

OTTAWA, Aug. 27.—Alms le rained
heavily in the afternoon and kept down
the attendance to a good extent, the
opening today of the all meeting of the
Connaught Park Jockey Club proved a
great success. The track, the muddy,
dried out under the sun and wind, and
was in remarkably good shape, consider-
ing the quantity of rain that had fallen.
The steepchase course was also equally
fast for its introductory feature, and
everything passed off without a hitch.
There were seven great races on the card
and only a couple of favorites rewarded
the bookies, as the majority of the
long shots that managed to come thru
did so with very little money behind them.
There was one exception to this in the
first race, which was won by Gorman
Brow, Mary Bud, Owners and friends
cleaned up handsomely, one man hitting
the books for nearly \$3000. The feature of
the day, the stakes of \$1000, was
carried off by Font, the P. J. Pons gel-
ding. Jockey Taylor, from Hayes' stable,
