

Entered Canadian West From United States-Few Canadians Emigrate.

According to reports received by the Canadian Pacific Railway the migration of Americans to western Canada continues in large volume. A report for the week ending October 7 shows that there entered western Canada by various ports from the United States 1187 persons with \$287,044 cash and effects valued at \$103,-458. Of these 444 were farmers. 191 laborers, 177 mechanics, 56 cierical workers, and 220 women and children. Of this number 893 were Americans and 58 Canadians returning.

During the same week Canada lost only 116 persons of various nationalities, who left to reside in the United States. Only 22 of these were farmers. In the week 462 homesteads were entered upon in western Canada, of which 130 were taken by Americans.
