BOOK POST.

A Book Packet may contain any number of separate books, publications, works of ture and art, maps or prints, photographs, daguerrotypes, when not on glass or in containing glass; any quantity of paper, veilum or parchment (to the exclusion of leand the books, maps, papers, &c., may be either written, printed, or plain, or any n of the three; and may be either British, Colonial, or Foreign.

Book Packages must be open at both ends or both sides. The rate on Book Packets between any place in Canada, and to Newfoundland

NEWSPAPER POST.

On newspapers published in the Dominion the postage is, if paid quarterly in adva either by the publisher or by the party to whom it is delivered:

If not paid in advance, r cent each. The commuted rate applies not only to papers culating within the Dominion, but also to subscribers in the United Kingdom, U. Sa and Newfoundland. All papers must be pre-paid before leaving Canada, if not the commuted rate, i cent each, but all transient papers, i. e. papers not from the public must be pre-paid 2 cents each by postage stamps.

Exchange papers pass free between publishers in Canada, and also to and from the United States and Newfoundland.

Papers from England via the United States are charged 2 cents each on delivery. Canadian mails free.

Postage on papers from the United States to regular subscribers in Canada, 10 Transient United States papers, 2 cents. (It has been decided by the Postmaster Gen of Britain that the initials of the sender of a newspaper on its cover is not forbidden by postal laws.)

MONEY ORDERS ON THE UNITED KINGDOM.

The Money Order Offices throughout the Dominion also draw upon all the Mo Order Offices in England, Ireland and Scotland, and the Channel Islands, for any sum u Lio sterling, and grant as many Orders for Lio sterling each as may be needed to mak the amount to be remitted. The terms are as under:
