SECOND CIRCUIT MEET AT DETROIT

Baby Trotters Furnish Best
Contest of Day at the Fair
Grounds, and Race is
Unfinished.

DETROIT, Sept. 16.—The baby trotters furnished the only real contest and practically all the excitement this afternoon at the first day's racing of Detroit's second Grand Circuit meeting at the Michigan State Fair Grounds. After the first three events on the program had been decided in straight heats, the youngsters came out and staged as pretty a contest as ever seen on the local track, Lord Allen, Dillon, Axworthy and Sweet Alice each winning one heat. The race then went over until tomorrow, because of darkness.

The great Baden was never hurried to win the 1 1/2 trot. He always was just a little in front and at the finish of each heat Rodney was looking back and slowing down.

Don Pronto led to the last turn in both heats of the 2 1/2 pace, but in the stretch drive Brannan Baughman had the speed and finished an easy winner. In the second heat Cox had his horse slowed down to a common jog at the wire.

Then came the two-year-old trotters in the Horsemans Futurity. Lord Allen went away in front in the first heat and led all the way home. Most of the time he was half a dozen lengths ahead of the field.

Dillon Axworthy was coming field, but broke inside the distance flag and finished fifth. Lord Allen in the next heat again led the bunch into the stretch, but Dillon Axworthy caught him.
