SINN FEIN WELCOMES NEW PROCLAMATION AS AIDING POLICY

Ireland Receives Quietly Order Pronouncing Organizations Illegal. ULSTERITES FOR UNION Will Demand at Orange Celebrations Repeal of the Home Rule Act.

Dublin, July 10.—The County Tipperary and Ireland have received quietly the proclamation of the government Monday declaring all Sinn Fein organizations and Irish volunteers in County Tipperary unlawful associations. The proclamation places all local activities in Tipperary under control of the military and prevents all persons from entering the district without a permit, thus restricting business.

London, July 10.—Reuter learns, in regard to British forces overseas, that the army on the Rhine numbers 296,000 and the army in France and Flanders 214,000, the latter mainly for salvage work, and also to supply the line of communication for the Rhine army, of which it is a reserve.

Twenty-Four Hour General Strike Scheduled in Paris for July 21st

Paris, July 10.—A general strike lasting 24 hours will begin at 5 o'clock in the morning of July 21 and terminate at 5 a.m. July 22, according to a statement issued from the labor exchange this afternoon. Instructions issued to the railway workers are that all trains in motion at 5 o'clock in the morning of July 21 must stop at the nearest watering and coaling station.

LEAGUE OF NATIONS A WORLD NECESSITY WILSON TO SENATE

President in Address Presents Peace Treaty and Covenant—Declines at Present to Construct Terms of Pact—Minor Compromises Necessary to Secure Support. Washington, July 10.—The peace treaty with its league of nations covenant was laid before the senate by President Wilson today in an address accounting to the country for his part in the negotiations at Versailles.
