The report that an American transatlantic armed steamer or auxiliary cruiser has been blown up by a torpedo while trying to force through the neck of the Santiago bottle comes from a Spanish source and cannot be entirely depended upon. It seems unlikely that the Americans would send an auxiliary cruiser to lead the way into the bottle. There is no doubt that they had decided to force the passage, but it was expected that the dynamite cruiser Vesuvius would detonate mines and that then the Iowa or Massachusetts would steam There has been much discussion among naval authorities for some years regarding the value of mines and torpedoes for the protection of harbors, but there has been no war to settle the question. The Americans have placed a high value on such appliances, and when they were talking of war with England over the Venezuela question, many of their newspapers contended that the city of New York need not fear a British fleet, as the harbor would be so well protected by mines and torpedoes that no fleet could enter it.
