EIGHTY THOUSAND DOLLARS SPENT.

This enormous expenditure at Victoria Mines is being made by Dr. Ludwig Mond of London, England, one of the firm of Brunner, Mond & Co., one of the largest chemical manufacturing houses in the world. Dr. Mond is many times a millionaire, and one of the greatest living authorities on Italian art. He became interested in the enormous nickel-copper deposits of the Sudbury district about two years ago. The firm of which Dr. Mond is one of the principals, owns the patents of the Solvay process of separating copper from nickel. A series of experiments made with the copper and nickel of the Sudbury district by this new process convinced Dr. Mond that he could reduce the cost of working the ore to such an extent that its commercial value would be almost doubled.
