Montgomery, Ala., Feb. 12.-A disastrous head-on collision occurred on the Louisville and Nashville railroad near Kirkland, killing Will User, engineer; Edward Davis, fireman, and three

Henry Davidson, engineer, and Will Lee were seriously injured. Charles Harrison, brakeman, had both legs cut off, and Brakeman Hughes was badly hurt. Both will die. SHOWED THE WRONG SIGNAL

Menominee, Mich., Feb. 12.-There was a rear-end collision on the Chicago, Milwaukee and St. Paul tracks at Carney's spur, six miles south of Iron Mountain. Conductor Anderson, of Iron Mountain, and Brakeman John Tews, of Green Bay, Wis., were killed.

A way freight from Iron Mountain crashed into a logging train, which was switching. Twenty cars were derailed and the engine ruined. Conductor Babcock, Engineer Karns and Fireman Smith, of the way freight,

escaped by jumping. The accident was caused by the alleged negligence of an operator, who was awakened by the sudden approach of the way freight and thoughtlessly pulled the block signal, "Track clear."
