Sir George Foster hesitated about reading the full list. He said that while there was a lot of material in it, there was cvery little information, so the question was changed to an order for return and the answer tabled. It showed that there had been 38 appointments of acting ministers since the date mentioned.

INCREASE INTEREST RATE GOVERNMENT BANKS PAY, IS FIELDING SUGGESTION

Considerable Discussion Is But It Will Likely Come Up

OTTAWA, March 15 .- Considerable interest attaches here to the recent suggestion in the House of Hon. W. S. Fielding, former minister of finance, that in view of the fact that money is growing dearer, and is likely to continue dear for the next number of years, the Government should increase the rate of interest in the Government Savings Banks to 4 per cent. The rate of interest at the present time is 3 per cent and is the same as that given by the chartered banks for the people's savings. Should the Government decide to increase the rate in the Governments Savings Banks, the chartered


