"Mr. Flood said the teamsters las year asked the committee for an increase to \$12, and that the committee recommended to the council that they be paid \$11. The further progress of matters, he stated, were as follows:

The council referred back the recommendation to the committee which left The council referred back the recommendation to the committee, which left the matter in the hands of the city engineer, and that official established a rate of \$9.90 a day.

Tuesday's deputation, said Mr. Flood, asked only that the previous recommendation for a rate of \$11 a day be put into effect. He added that unless this request were granted the city certainly would have trouble getting teamsters this season.
