#### HOTELMEN FINED

Five Hoteliers Found Infringing the License Law.

HAMILTON, March 11.—(Special).—As a result of the activities of government detectives the following hotel men were fined in police court this morning: White Star \$40; Revere House, \$40; Woodbine Hotel, \$60; Waldorf Hotel, \$80; George Hotel, \$40.

#### Ask Duty on Tinplate

OTTAWA, March 11.—Application has been made to the government for the imposition of a duty on tin plate, galvanized plate and black plate, in order to give some protection to the Canadian industry against British and European imports. Tin plate is now manufactured at Morrisburg, and while the dumping clauses of the Tariff Act now give no protection against the imports of American material, there is no protection from British imports. Last year Canada imported tin plate worth \$1,516,000 from Great Britain. From the United States the imports amounted to \$19,886. Imports of galvanized plate totaled \$942,838, all from Great Britain.
