

TRADE WITH RUSSIA POLITELY DECLINED BY UNITED STATES

Soviet Must First Make Fundamental Changes in Its Economic System.

REPLY SENT TO LENINE

Washington, March 25.—The United States government notified the Soviet authorities in Russia today that resumption of trade between Russia and the United States could not be considered until fundamental changes had been made in the economic system underlying the Soviet regime.

Safety of human life, guarantee of property rights, free labor and observance of the sanctity of contracts were among the requirements laid down in a brief note by Secretary of State Hughes as essential if the doors of commerce between the two countries are to be opened.

The communication adds: "Convincing evidence of the consummation of such changes must be furnished before the United States government even cared to discuss the subject. These requirements, the note declared, lay at the foundation of Russian productivity, by which alone the nation could hope to rebuild her foreign trade and make herself attractive economically to the nations with which she desires to exchange products."


ASSAILANT OF TURNKEY IS ADJUDGED INSANE

RED PROPAGANDA FOOLED KRONSTADT

Soldiers and Workmen Investigating Whether Surrender Was Justified.

Helsingfors, Finland, March 25.—The sailors and workmen of Kronstadt and outlying places, who surrendered to the Bolsheviks, have appointed a non-partisan commission to investigate whether they were deceived into abandoning their comrades in Kronstadt by lying propaganda.

At the forts around Petrograd Bolshevik commissars dressed in the gray uniforms of the old regime were paraded before the soldiers as officials captured from Kronstadt.
