RAILWAY WRECKS KILL 10,000.

Awful Harvest of Death in U. S. During One Year

New York, Oct. 7.— Official bulletins prepared by the interstate commerce commission show that in the last year 1984 persons were killed in railroad wrecks and 78,247 injured.

An officer of the commission stated that the "increase of fatalities annually is regular, growing with the extension of the railroad and population.




