There seems at present to be a peculiar necessity for its existence and extension, in consequence of the regulations adopted, by which the Parish relief is refused to all who are not resident within the limits of the Alms House. Numerous are the cases in a community of this kind, where families of respectable character are placed in circumstances of extreme difficulty, and when a small amount of assistance in the hour of sickness may afford incalculable relief, when at the same time it would not be desirable that they should become inmates of an Alms House. To meet the wants of persons occircumstanced, such a Society seems absolutely necessary. The necessities of such persons it has assistiuously relieved to the utmost of its means. It has extended its aid, at all times, to the sick and aged, without any reserve on account of their religious opinious, and has for this reason, a peculiar relaim on the general support of the community.—Yet this Society, for want of a sufficient number of Annual subscribers, are compelled from time to time to seek accession to their funds by extra exertion, while at Halifax, where the demands are not near so great in proportion to the population, the Benevolent Society have annually at command not less than £100, which enables its agent to bestow its assistance freely. Then why should not the inhabitants of Saint John, who are proverbial for giving liberally where need exists, exercise it in this instance, as well as others that make their appeal to them. The Committee, while they return their grateful thanks to these who have aided them, would beg respectfully to press these considerations on the minds of all the benevolent members of the community, and venture to hope, that under the blessing of a higher power, the Society may be more effectually sustained in years to come.
