And I do faithfully promise to the utmost of my power to support, maintain, and defend the fuccession of the crown against the descendants of the of the faid James, and against all other persons what soever; which succession, by an act entitled "an act for the further limitation of the crown, and better fecuring the rights and liberties of the subject," is and stands limited to the princels Sophia, electrels and durchels dowager of Hanover, and the heirs of her body, being protestants. And all these things I doplainly and sincerely acknowledge and fwear, according to thefe exexpress words by me spoken, and according to the plain and common fense and understanding of the same words without any equivocation, mental evalian, or fecret refervation, what foever. And I do make this recognition, acknowledgement, abjuration, renunciation and promife, heartily willingly and iroly, upon the true faith of a christian : So help me God.
