"MY MESSAGE TO LABOR"

Striking Arrangement of Kaiser and
His War Party by British Mem-
ber of Parliament

(By Ben Tillett, M. P.)
Gorged with murder-blood and treas-
ure, the Kaiser, Ludendorff and the
whole gang of Junkers—their maddest
ambitions more than satisfied by the
crushing of small nations, the corrup-
tion of other nations, and the anarchy
of Russia—started out on a new and
still more arrogant offensive.

Gorged With Territory.
They are flinging away millions more
of lives of the industrial people of the
European nations, including their own,
to gratify their insatiable ambitions.
They are bleeding remorselessly the
working people of the world to gorge
themselves with territory, military
glory, and wealth. It all makes the
position terribly clear to us who carry
the industrial burden. The characteris-
tic of the bully-German is simply
rapacity. And now he has to face the
cost of his own supreme mistake.

The German Mistake.
His mistake is thus defying the world
has brought him today face to face with
the moral antagonism of the world or-
ganized into an iron military resistance,
and behind that resistance is the psy-
chology of a great spiritual courage back-
ground of the organized fight that the free
nations are putting up. All nations can
now see that to be at the mercy of Ger-
many, as the peoples of Eastern Europe,
to experience the grinding heel of un-
relenting oppression.

New Brutalities.
The German is now adding to the un-
speaked barbarism of the war such
wicked implements as the new gas that
strips men's bodies of clothes and skin
and murders them where they
stand in trench or dug-out. But the
Germans are beginning to regret their
own malignancy by reason of our ef-
fective reprisals, and I hope that every-
thing will be done to quicken transport,

If the Tyrants Won.
If such tyrants became triumphant on
the western front what a hell would be
before us! Even with victory attending
us, the industrial workers will be faced

to an enemy, the burden upon labor
would amount to an overwhelming
slavery. Taxes for indemnity payments
and for enormous armaments would be
charged to our backs and to the backs
of our children and their children. With
food still at high prices our whole popu-
lation would become intolerable. The
greater part of that whole burden would
necessarily be assumed by industry and
industrialism.

"We Must Back Up Our Own Men."
What it would mean to have our own
debts with those of the enemy superim-
posed upon them baffles the imagination.
But that is what would come upon us if
we allowed our army and navy to be
crushed by any slackness or apathy on
our part. We must back up our men
with every effort and give to their ef-
ficients every succor. There is not a

Who Ben Tillett Is.
Benjamin Tillett, who sent this mes-
sage to labor, is one of England's for-
most labor leaders. A man of extra-
ordinary industry and energy, he has
done much for the cause of the working
man in the organization of trades unions,
and in pleading the cause of labor with
the pen, from the platform and in par-
liament where he sits as independent
member for North Salford. He has
been at various times brick-maker,
boat-maker, a fisherman and a sailor in
the merchant and naval services, having
been involved from the latter. Leaving
the sea he became a dockman, organized
the Dockers' Union, and is now secre-
tary of the Dock, Wharf, Riverside and
General Workers' Union of Great Brit-
ain and Ireland.

Ben Tillett, since the war broke out,
has labored unceasingly to promote war
industry, and particularly the produc-
tion of munitions. He has three visited
the fighting line and has delivered in-
numerable lectures in support of the
vigorous prosecution of the war, both by
the armies in the field and by the in-
dustrial workers at home.
