Ottawa, Mar. 19-It is understood that

the government, in connection with plans being matured to provide for increased production for the season of 1919 and subsequent years, has had placed before it a suggestion that contractors who em-ploy large forces of men should be given contracts to cultivate large areas of land contracts to cultivate large areas of land for fixed periods. A five-year period, it is said, has been suggested, because it is thought that the price of grain is likely to remain high for a few years after the war. The details of the scheme, it is stated, are being worked out, but definite conclusions have not been arrived at as to its feasibility.
