TAR STILL EXPLODES. Sydney, N. S., Feb. 9. — Richard Powell, sixty-five, is severely burned about the legs and may die, as a result of the explosion of a big tar still which wrecked part of the plant of the Dominion Tar and Chemical Company here at 6.45 tonight. The property damage is estimated at \$10,000.

The violence of the explosion shook houses for a radius of several hundred yards and the shock was distinctly felt throughout the city. The roof was blown off the building in which the stills are located. The ruins took fire and gave the firemen a hard fight of more than two hours. The damage is confined to one small section of the plant and will not materially affect the general operation of the company.


