In any other portion of the Province there is not the slightest trouble with the Indeans, nor to my knowledge have any verations questions arisen in their mends as to their abougual rights to the whole country, except where they have in the first instance, been formented and agetaled by these leachings., The spectacle of men who, are permetted by the Government. under the impression that their labors are confued to a respected and selfsacreficing calling, to derect the ellegal connects of their charges, and otherwise to poison their winds must be very currous to the layal, and intelligent portion of those who can recognise their true object and, as aften wiged the recommendation that an efficient agent should be appointed to reside in the locality, who would be instructed and properly supported to mangurate and enforce the provisions of the Indian act cannot be too soon adopted.
