With its motives revealed the Workers' Party will find its attempts to win proselytes opposed by the sane majority of the workers of the Dominion. Sovietism and communism have not brought such peace, prosperity and happiness to Russia as to lead Canadians to desire their introduction into this country. Neither will a political party which confesses itself the tool of revolutionary agencies in a foreign land commend itself to patriotic citizens of the Dominion.
