Ottawa, Jan. 8.—The 43rd D. C. O. R., is shortly to be furnished with the celebrated Webb equipment. This was announced by General Macdonald, director of clothing and equipment today.

The Webb equipment is a practical field equipment which has been in use in the British imperial army and has been proven efficient. It is designed to furnish the soldiers in the field with all possible comfort, that may be given him without impairing his usefulness or hampering his movements on the march.

The whole militia force in Canada will be supplied with the Webb equipment, said General Macdonald, "But it takes some time to furnish six thousand men in this way."
