A SHIPPING ORDER.

C. B. Lockhart, collector of customs here, has received the following order in-council passed at Ottawa on April 30:
Whereas it is deemed desirable to prohibit all sailing vessels registered in Canada from engaging in voyages from a port in Canada, or any foreign port, to a port in the United Kingdom, or to any other port in Europe, or vice versa, without the knowledge or consent of the government of Canada:
Therefore His Excellency the Governor General in Council, under and in virtue of the provisions of the War Measures Act, 1914, is pleased to make the following regulations and the same are hereby made and enacted accordingly:
1. Every sailing ship registered in Canada is prohibited from engaging in any voyage, after the 1st of May, 1917, from a port in Canada, or any foreign port, to a port in the United Kingdom, or to any other port in Europe, or vice versa, unless a license to do so has been granted to or in favor of the owners or charterers of such sailing ship.
2. The committee of persons appointed by the minister of marine and fisheries, under the provisions of the order in council of March 11, 1916, respecting the licensing of steamships exceeding 500 tons gross tonnage, shall have power to grant the licenses required by the next preceding paragraph. Licenses may be general with reference to any such sailing ship and its voyages, or may be special with reference to a particular voyage.
All sailing ships violating any of the provisions of these regulations shall be subject to forfeiture.
