More than 120,000,000 tons of navai and military stores and more than 2,000,000 animals also were transported. The British fleet and auxiliary craft free during the war from a total of 2,500,000 tons to a total of 6,500,000 tons, while the personnel increased from 146,000 to 406,000. London, Nov. 18.—Since allied ship-ping has been convoyed on the var-ious sea routes leading to the princi-gal European porta, more than twenty six million tons of foodstuffs and thirty-five million tons of war muni-tions have been brought to England alone.
