of these Rules, shall be enforced at the discretion of the officer commanding, by deducting the same from the pay of each member of the Company, that is to say—

And that a regular account of all such fines be kept, and the manner of expenditure of such fines shall therein be duly accounted fer—*Provided* that the fines so paid shall be applied in some manner for the general purposes of this Company, and the senior officer for the time being shall be the person to account for the same.

VI. That the foregoing Rules, the Sections of the Militia Act or Acts then in force, having reference to Field Batteries of Artillery, and an account of fines and their expenditure, be read at the head of this Company at the commencement of each of the general annual musters for drill and exercise, prescribed by the 32nd Section of the Militia Act of 1855, by the senior officer then in command.
