

Urge Students' Council Bent On Raising BePlaced Soon Prestige Value Of Awards; Changes in the operation of Pharos, Dalhousie's Year Book, make it imperative that all stu-dents who desire a copy of this Fewer "D's" To Be Given

An important meeting of the Dalhousie Council of Students was held Sunday afternoon, at which the most outstanding work was the drastic re-organization of the point system. The point value of a great many campus jobs, especially those of the higher point bracket, was lowered. The Council decided on this action in an effort to cut down on the number of gold and silver "D's" awarded, and in this way to raise the prestige value of the "D's".

Various other amendments were made to the constitution and it was decided that student nurses and graduate study students would be awarded a representative on the Council.

In the field of finance, an additional \$300 was voted to Pharos. get this amount the Council had to cut into their 10% holding fund.

It was also brought up at the gathering that a certain local sports announcer made remarks condemning the Dalhousie athletic teams. A spy was appointed to investigate the charge, and if true, it will be reported to the proper authorities and the guilty one chastised as befits the crime.

Proposed Amendments to the Council of Students Constitution

Art. 1, Sec. 2-delete word "Dalhousie Personal Services"

Art. 4, Sec. 2-rewritten as follows: "The departments or Facul-ties of the University shall for the purpose of Sec. 1 of this Article be as follows: Arts and Science, from which five representatives shall be elected; Engineering and Medicine, from each of which two representatives shall be elected; and Commerce, Dentistry, Graduate Studies, Law and Pharmacy from which one representative each shall be elected.

Sec. 4 (b)—"There shall be appointed each year by the incoming Council one representative from the Faculty of Graduate Studies, by October 15.

Art. 6, Sec. 5 (f)—delete old section and insert "for the purpose of election, members of the Student Body who are taking Post Gradu-ate Courses in Education and Public Health Nursing shall be con-sidered as members of the Faculty of Graduate Studies."

Art. 7, Sec. 2-delete "Dalhousie Personal Services"

Art. 8, Sec. 1 (h)—delete and reletter following Sec. 8—delete and renumber the following sections.

Art. 15, Sec. 2 (a)—add from word prescribed "in Sections 4, 5 7 of this Article". and
