tingent at Mexico and Munich and fifth place finisher in last year's world championship at Tempere
Finland gave an excellent
account of his increasingly
impressive stature by
finishing close to Rumanian
world championship hope Inescu Patzaichin.

In the 10,000 metre long distance marathon race Wood was clocked at 55:50 minutes crossing the finish line slightly behind the Rumanian but well ahead of Denmark's Boystom and Greg Smith, who turned in a notable 59:50 time. "The wind made conditions a bit choppy said Commodore

On Saturday ideal conditions greeted the paddlers as Wood extended his Rumanian opponent Patzaichin, one of the top ranking favorites for the world championship next October, in chalking up second place with a 4:28.8 time.

But from Canada's point of view the highlight must be the 500 metre sprint which had the Rumanian in first place with 2:3.35 minutes followed by Wood at 2:4.54 and young Smith in third at 2:6.65, trailed by Germany's Wuster and Denmark's
