The Deputy Supt. General,-

as per
Mr. Macrae visited the locality of Manouan Lake, in Quebec, and made a report on the Indians resident there on the 28th June, 1898. He recommended that a small reserve be laid out for them at a locality which he described in his report and of which he sent a rough sketch.

The Crown Lands Department of Quebec forwarded a plan showing Lake Manouan and the adjacent land with a request that the land required by this Department should be plotted thereon. It ^{was} impossible, however, to identify the locality on the said plan.

Mr. Macrae has now been able to furnish the Department with a plan in better detail from which it may be possible for the Lands Department of Quebec to identify the land we are asking for.

I beg to submit hereunder a draft of a letter to the Assistant Commissioner.
