To which the S<sup>r</sup> Ind<sup>ns</sup> made answer that they would deliver their Message to this Board in Case they would send for Coll<sup>l</sup> John Schuyler Agent for the Government of the Massachusetts Bay, that they had done in Relation to the Government of New York, and they had agreed to treat w<sup>th</sup> him alone in Case he could not be present here, The Com<sup>rs</sup> told them they would not hinder Coll<sup>l</sup> John Schuyler from being present but had reasons to suspect he would not come, and if they would not deliver their Message as desired by the Government of Boston they might expect this Board would acquaint him of it, and they might to their pleasure to treat w<sup>th</sup> Coll<sup>l</sup> Schuyler alone, that no person would hinder their so doing, but had one thing more to offer, to desire them that if any of us people were inclin<sup>d</sup> to go to Boston to pay the Gov<sup>r</sup> their a visit they would be well entertained
