	14 Mar.1943		Clear to partly cloudy. Fire in Barrack Block 15. Considerable damage, but no casualties. The Commanding Officer, Group Captain F.A. Sampson, proceeded on Temporary Duty to New York City to make recordings for an Overseas broadcast.	
	15 Mar.1943		Partly cloudy to overcast. Snow in afternoon. Normal flying in morning. Ceiling closed in in afternoon. Flying Officer Stevens from Rockcliffe on the Station for Court of Inquiry about the fire in Barrack Block 15.	
	16 Mar.1943		High winds and freezing rain. No flying. Flying washed out. Final rehearsal for "Uplands 1943 Air Review", to be held at the Red Triangle Club, Ottawa, Wednesday, 17th March.	
	17 Mar.1943		Overcast. Snow showers in some districts. Normal flying. "Uplands 1943 Air Review" was presented in Ottawa, and was a tremendous success. Wings party, Course #69 was held this evening in the Recreation Hall, after graduates had dinner in the Officers' Mess. The Wings party was a success, and the evening was enjoyed by every one.	
	18 Mar.1943		Cloudy to overcast. Snow flurries. Flying washed out at 1030 hours due to blizzard. Normal flying in afternoon, and 2 evening shifts. R164800 LAC Forbes, A.S. nosed up Harvard A1187 at Main Aerodrome. C-1 Category. No injury. Station dance was held in the Recreation Hall in the evening, the Station orchestra providing the music.	5
