tuberculosis on my hands and this with other obligations makes it extremely difficult for me to incur the sacrifice of time and means which public life necessitates. You may know that any service you may be able to render my father at this moment will be more than appreciated by myself as well as by him, and if you can possibly manage to be present at the meeting on the 12th I shall be exceptionally gratefully. As I have said in the outset I would not write you at this time but as I feel that the matter is so critical as to make it necessary to seek the support of all my friends.
