Dear Mr. King:

With the two hundred dollars which was forwarded to you yesterday through the Consolidation Coal Company's offices here, we have advanced to you since the date of your engagement with Mr. Rockefeller, Four hundred thirty-five dollars and eighty-four cents (\$435.84) as follows:
