

INDUSTRIAL ORGANIZATION.

3. Programme for 1937-38.

The sum of \$121,700 is provided in the Estimates to permit engaging additional technical and clerical staff for the Supply Committee and to cover travelling expenses of those engaged in inspection of industrial plants.

It is hoped to complete the survey of industry in two years.

For the investigation of the best means of obtaining technical supplies of a kind not procurable from the ordinary commercial types of industrial plant in Canada a special investigating committee consisting of one representative of each service, with draughtsmen and clerical staff, is contemplated.

Cooperation of the Engineering Institute of Canada, the Society of Chemical Industry, Canadian Manufacturers' Association, Canadian Institute of Mining and Metallurgy is proposed through asking these bodies, through an auxiliary advisory committee on which these bodies would be represented.

Of the \$121,700 in the estimates for this purpose the sums of \$21,700 is found in the vote for the Permanent Force establishment. Existing staff cannot do the work of the Supply Committee without neglect of their present duties.
