I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your communication of the 11th instant, No. 129 J. S., enclosing a letter addressed you by Mr. AGNES IRWIN in connection with application of the AGNES RIVER LUMBER COMPANY for the privilege of constructing dams in front of the two Indian Reserves, Sections No. 4. of the AGNES Lake Band, and the one-half No. 1. of the LITTLE CHAMPAGNE Band, and in reply to say that, in view of the altitude of the AGNES Lake Band, it would not appear advisable that the permission asked for should be given, but the arrangement made with the LITTLE CHAMPAGNE Band needs with approval, and you should so advise Mr. AGNES IRWIN.
