Ferguson, and patrolled to Birtle, Man., for the purpose of accompanying A.G. Smith, Indian Agent and his Clerk on Treaty Payments in the Birtle Indian Agency. SUB-DIVISION On arrival in Birtle, the Indian Agent and Clerk were contacted and the writer immediately Daughin S/U D3510-10-1-1 left Birtle with the aforementioned members of the Treaty Party, per Indian Departmental car to Lizard Point Indian DETACHMENT Reserve in the Rossburn district where Treaty Payments were Russell made to members of the Waywaysecappo Band. Patrol returned 1.1-9-47 to Birtle in the late p.m., the writer remaining at that point overnight. P.C.R. In the a.m. of the 14th inst., the writer again left Birtle in company of the Indian Agent & his clerk and patrolled per 1.0. car to the Riding Mountain Russell Indian Reserve in the Elphinstone dist., and Treaty was "First" paid to members of this reserve. After payments were made the patrol proceeded to Minnedosa where the Treaty Party remained overnight. On the 15th inst., the Treaty Party patrolled per I.D. car to the Rolling River I.R. where A. R. V. No. Treaty was paid, the Treaty party returning to Birtle in the late p.m., the writer remaining at that point overnight. On the 16th inst., at the request of the Indian agent, the writer proceeded to the Bird Tail I.R. and assisted the Indian Agent after having contacted the N.G.O. i/c Russell Det. During the period spent on the Bird Tail I.R. the writer made enquiries for one Warrie BEARBULL; a warrant being held at this detachment for this subject. Please refer to file "Warrie BRARBULL & Godfrey BEARBULL, Non-Treaty Indians, Birdtail Indian Reservation, Manitoba, Section 135, The Indian Act. The writer returned to Russell in the late p.m. of the 16th.
