Sir,

I have to confirm the following telegram sent you yesterday, "Permission hereby given during pleasure of Superintendent General for temporary wharf upon consent of Indians being obtained and upon such terms as may be agreed upon provided no injury done any Indian holder." Upon the band passing a resolution granting the Kettle Valley Railway Company permission to ~~construct~~ construct temporary wharf on the Okanagan Indian Reserve No. 1 and stating the amount of compensation agreed upon by the band and the company's representatives and approved by yourself, agreement may be arranged between the band and the company provided that the construction of the said wharf doesnot in any way injure the holding of any member of the band.
