as soon as possible, and at some later time I shall undoubtedly hear from her concerning it.

Mrs. Foster left the city Monday night for British Columbia. She is to stay in Winnipeg two days and to reach Naramata next Monday night. I am, of course, anxious to receive a report concerning Katherine, the baby, and especially concerning Carroll.

The general expectation is that Parliament will prorogue next week and most people seem to expect an election in the summer.

I hope that you are coming to Ottawa for a few days at least. It would be delightful to have a horse-back ride with you.
