

- A. Yes, Sir.
- Q. What is your job?
- A. A warden.
- Q. On any particular building?
- A. No, Sir, I have been on them all. It depended on the staff going on leave. We would spend a week in one living hut or cell block and then probably in another living hut or cell block.
- Q. Have you ever been on duty in Living Hut 2?
- A. Yes.
- Q. How often?
- A. Quite a few times.
- Q. Did you have occasion to speak to the accused in Living Hut 2?
- A. Nothing serious. Just tell him to be quiet.
- Q. That is the usual orders you would give to any SUS?
- A. Yes, Sir.
- Q. How do you account for the fact that you know the accused?
- A. I knew the accused from once when he was wearing his hat and he had one of the staff from his unit and I was with him when they met.
- Q. You are telling the Court the first time you met the accused he was wearing a hat?
- A. Yes, Sir.
- Q. Is it unusual for an SUS to wear a hat?
- A. No, Sir. He had a Black Watch hat on.
- Q. How was he dressed on this occasion?
- A. In his denim without a hat. I believe correctly he didn't have his tunic on. Just pants, sweater and no hat.
- Q. What sort of sweater?
- A. I can't recall.
- Q. Was it khaki?
- A. I think it was an issue.
- Q. Long sleeves or short sleeves?
- A. I couldn't say.
- Q. Could you see exactly how he was dressed from 300 feet?
- A. Yes, Sir. On the tower he didn't have a tunic on or a hat.
- Q. Did he have a sweater?
- A. Yes.
- Q. Long or short sleeves?
- A. I don't remember.
- Q. You are quite sure he didn't have the top of his denim on?
- A. Yes, Sir.
- Q. These cell blocks, am I correct in stating that they are made of concrete?
- A. Yes.
- Q. Did I understand you to say that at the base they are about 12 feet square and 6 feet at the top?
- A. Yes, Sir, approximately.
- Q. Am I also correct in understanding that there are four upright at the bottom?
- A. Yes.
