**CORSON'S SIDING.** A post office and station on the Nip Div Mid Div G T R, in Bexley township, Victoria County, 34 miles north of Lindsay, the county seat, and 3½ south of Cobocok, the present terminus of the Nipissing Division. Nearest bank at Cannington. Population, 30. Mail daily. Wm H Decatur, postmaster.

**CORUNNA.** A village on the St Clair river, in Moore township, Lambton County, 7 miles south of Sarnia, the county seat and nearest banking point, and 4 north of Court-right, on the St C br C Div MCRR, its nearest railway point. Settled in 1850. It contains Methodist, Presbyterian and Catholic churches and public schools, and ships cordwood and logs. Stages daily to Sarnia, Mooretown, Courtright, Sombra and Wallaceburg, fares 30c, 20c, 25c, 50c and \$1.50 respectively. Population, 300. Telegraph,
