2. Parse, explaining the construction, each word of the first two lines of extract (B).

3. Decline together in both numbers *huc cura* and *ater turbo*. Write out the tenses *cernes*, *morebo*, and *speculantur*.

4. Give principal parts of the verbs to which belong, *parce*, *cernes*, *feres*, *ponet*, *dispulerat*, *arexrat*, *ibat*.

5. State, with short examples, some—say four—of the principal uses of the Genitive Case in Latin.

6. Translate into Latin:

(a) Quicker than the word he calms the swollen waters, and puts to flight the gathered clouds and restores the sun.

(b) Not unacquainted with misfortune, I learn to succour the wretched

1. Translate, without unnecessary change of construction:—

(A) Hostes prælio superati, simul atque se ex fuga recuperunt, statim ad Cæsarem legatos de pace miserunt: obsides datus, quævis imperasset sese facturos, polliciti sunt. Unde cum his legatis Commius Atrebates venit, quem supra demonstraveram a Cæsare in Britanniam præmissum. Hunc illi e navi egressum quum ad eos oratoris modo imperatoris man data perficeret, comprehenderant atque in vincula conjecterant: tum, prælio facto, remisorunt et in petenda pace ejus rei culam in multitudinem contulerunt, et propter imprudentiam ut ignoscatur petiverunt. Cæsar questus, quod, quum ultiro in continentem legatis missis pacem ab se petissent, bellum sine causa intulissent, ignorare imprudentiae dixit, obsidesque imperavit: quorum illi partem statim dederunt, partem, ex longinquieribus locis arcessitam, paucis diebus sese datus dixerunt. Interea suos remigrare in agos jussérunt, principesque undique convenire et se civitatesque suas Cæsari commendare cooperant.
