## THE CANADIAN NORTH-WEST HOMESTEAD

REGULATIONS.

Any oven numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manituba inch-West Euritzerien, excepting 8 and 28, which has not been banded, or reserved to provide wood lets for cettiers, or supposes, may be homostooded upon by any porsue who is the us of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent marter section, of 160 acros, more or less.

#### ENTRY.

settler who has been granted an entry for a homestead is required the provisions of the Deminion Lands Act and the amendments rests, to perform the conditions connected therewith, under one of following plans:—

(i) At least six months' raddence upon and cultivation of the land each year during the term of three years.

(B) If the father (or mottier, if the father is deceased) of the home-steader resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for the requirements as to residence may be satisfied by such person re-siding with the father or mether.

(3) If a sottler was entitled to and has obtained entry for a second homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied by residence upon the first homestead, if the second homestead is in the vicinity of the first homestead.

(4) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land. The term 'vicinity' used above is meant to indicate the same town, township or an adjoining or cornering township. A settler who avails himself of the provisions of Clauses (2), (3) or (4) must cultivate 30 acres of his homestead, or substitute 20 head of stock, with buildings for their accommodation, and have besides 80 acres substantially fenced.

The privilege of a second entry is restricted by law to those settlers only who completed the duries upon their first homesteads to entitle them to patent on re-before the 2nd June, 1889.

Every homesteader who falls to comply with the requirements of the homestead law is liable to ave his entry cancelled, and the land may be again thrown open for entry.

APPLICATION FOR PATENT

should be made at the end of three years, before the Local agent, Sub-Agent, or the Homestead Inspector. Before making application for patent, the settler must give six months' notice in writing to the Com-missioner of Dominion Lands, at Ottawa, of his intention to do so.
