SYNOD RESOLUTIONS.

The following resolutions were adopted at the last session of the Synod:

1. "That this Synod desires again emphatically to call the attention of the Clergy to the resolutions heretofore passed by it entrusting to the Woman's Auxiliary the carrying out of the P. M. A. scheme, and directing the establishment of a Missionary Association in every congregation in which there is no branch of the Woman's Auxillary. That this Synod recognizes with great appreciation the work done by the Woman's Auxillary as executive of P. M. A., and earnestly hopes that every facility will be afforded for the operation of that Society in raising money for Diocesan Missions."

2. "Whereas the grant to the Diocese of Algoma expired on 30th April, 1898, and whereas the said Diocese is still in need of such grant from this Diocese, therefore be it resolved that the grant of \$1,000 be made for a further period of three years from the expiry of the last grant."

3. The resolutions passed at the session of 1898: "That in the opinion of the Synod no Clerical or Lay representative of a Mission receiving aid from the Mission Fund should be elected as a member of the Mission Board," was rescinded.

4. "The members of the Synod, both Clerical and Lay, desire to congratulate his Lordship, the Bishop, on having been permitted under such favourable auspices to enter upon the 21st year of his Episcopate in this Diocese; to tender to his Lordship the assurance of their affectionate loyalty and support, and to record their deep sense of gratitude to Almighty God for the large measure of prosperity, progress, and Christian unity which the Diocese has been permitted to enjoy during the twenty years of his Lordship's Episcopate."

The total returns through the P. M. C. for the year ending March, 1899, was \$2,633.96, of which \$3,079.04 was for Diocesan Missions. Running expenses for the year, \$6.40, deducted from the undesignated moneys.

With an earnest desire to increase, if possible, active interest and workers in this most capable method of raising money for the numerous Mission fields, Diocesan, Domestic and Foreign, the Woman's Auxiliary, at their last Board meeting, decided to enlarge the Parochial Missionary Collection Committee by the addition of one member from each city Church where these collections are made, said member to be nominated by the branch President.

A method of working has been decided upon, and this Committee will be prepared not only to report the progress or otherwise of their work at their quarterly meetings, but also at their own W. A. branch meetings, and if desired by their Rectors will send a full quarterly report to the Wardens of their respective Churches.

A Clergy House has been established at Minden, one of the most extensive of our Mission fields, where the Rev. J. E. Fenning, the Missionary in charge, will be assisted by two of our lately ordained Deacons, the Rev. L. W. Broughall, and the Rev. G. E. Ryerson. The following extracts from a letter from Mr. Fenning to a member of the Woman's Auxiliary will prove interesting:—

We are nearly settled down now, and after Synod expect to get to work in earnest. But it will take some time for us to get into a properly organized system of working such a large district. We have seven Stations to start on, and expect to open one or two more as time goes on. In addition to which I hope to add a week night school house service about three miles out of the village on the south side. Part of this will have to be dropped in the winter, as we do not expect to get people to walk through the snow as regularly as they walk the woods in summer. It is a huge responsibility for three such young men, and nothing can do us so much good and help us so much as the prayers of the various branches of the Woman's Auxiliary that know our needs and circumstances. Upon this I feel we can thoroughly depend.
